

Request for Applications (RFA) Webinar for Guiding an Improved Dementia Experience (GUIDE) Model

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) will host a Request for Applications (RFA) webinar for the Guiding an Improved Dementia Experience (GUIDE) Model at 2:00 PM ET on Thursday, November 30. Interested participants are encouraged to attend the webinar to learn more about the GUIDE Model, the Request for Applications, and the application process.

The GUIDE Model will test an alternative payment methodology for participating dementia care programs to deliver a package of care management and coordination, caregiver education and support, and GUIDE Respite Services to Medicare beneficiaries with dementia and their caregivers. The model will launch July 1, 2024, and will run for eight years.

The Greenlights Grant Initiative is composed of bipartisan lawmakers who were key to the passage of the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act. They are committed to making America's schools safer and ensuring the wellbeing of the nation's youth.

Included in this initiative is highlighting school safety grants which are designed to bolster school security, improve wellness and mental health services in schools, and create a healthier learning environment. The Greenlights Grant Initiative focuses on the grants included in the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act.

<u>US Department of Energy (DOE) - Renew America's Nonprofits</u>

The Office of State and Community Energy Programs (SCEP) at the U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) is in the next phase of the <u>Renew America's Nonprofits</u> grant, a competitive award that aims to reduce energy use and costs in buildings owned and operated by 501(c)(3)s.

\$45 million will be awarded to improve energy efficiency in approximately 300 nonprofit buildings across

America.
What interested nonprofits can do now:
DOE encourages all applicants to stay active in the pursuit of energy improvements and hopes nonprofits will sign up for and utilize the Teaming List to explore partnerships with stakeholders who could advance their efficiency and clean energy goals. ArtsHERE supports organizations that have demonstrated a commitment to equity within their practices and programming and have undertaken consistent engagement with underserved groups/communities.
Grants are for specific projects that will strengthen the organization's capacity to sustain meaningful community engagement and increase arts participation for underserved groups/communities. Grantees have access to peer-learning and technical assistance opportunities designed to share knowledge and build networks.
The deadline to submit a Statement of Interest is 11:59 p.m. ET on January 19, 2024.

FY 2023 AFG Programs Status Update

The FY 2023 AFG application period is expected to open January 2024. More information will be forthcoming as definitive dates are set. In the meantime, there are several things that can be done to start

preparing for the next funding opportunity.

Below is a list of things that you can do **now** to start preparing for the upcoming FY 2023 AFG Application Period.

- Verify your organization's <u>SAM.gov</u> account is **Active.**
- Ensure grant writing staff have accounts and appropriate permissions in <u>FEMA GOV</u>.
- Conduct a **Risk Assessment** to determine your greatest needs. Compare your needs to the priorities of the program once the FY23 funding notice is released to identify what you should request.
- Poll vendors to start determining the costs of items you plan to request.
- If requesting a vehicle, establish your committee and develop specifications.
- Use the <u>Application Checklist</u> to gather information needed to complete the application.
- Use the **Self-Evaluation Sheets** to start drafting the four scored sections of the application narrative. These documents provide the exact criteria that panelists will be looking for in your narrative at panel review. There is one for <u>Operations and Safety</u> and another for <u>Vehicle</u> applications.
- Use the <u>Narrative Development Guide</u> to help identify ways that you can address the criteria outlined in the Self-Evaluation Sheets.
- Write your narrative now. It is easily pasted into the application once the application period opens. This will allow ample time for others to review what you've written and provide feedback.
- Contact your Regional Fire Program Representative with any questions.

<u>AmeriCorps Funding Opportunities for Senior Companion and Foster Grandparent Projects</u>

AmeriCorps Seniors invites organizations to submit applications for the FY 2024 Senior Companion and Foster Grandparent programs. These funding opportunities specifically help AmeriCorps Seniors focus Senior Companion and Foster Grandparent projects on issues that are critical to communities and help expand the programs to more geographies.

Programs that include the following programmatic characteristics will receive priority consideration. **Please** read the Notices of Funding for a complete list of funding priorities.

Senior Companion Program

Under this program, programming must engage adults 55 and older to serve as volunteers who help other older adults and those with disabilities live independently. Activities may include providing support and/or facilitating access to services and resources that contribute to independent living, including:

- Projects that propose to raise public awareness about the challenges and needs of family caregivers.
- Projects serving people with arrest/conviction records, providing reentry opportunities.
- Programs that support civic bridge building projects.

Foster Grandparent Program

Under this program, grants must provide and/or facilitate access to services and resources that contribute to improved educational outcomes for economically disadvantaged people, especially children and youth, and

those with special and/or exceptional needs. Activities may include facilitating access to services and resources that contribute to school readiness, improve academic performance, and/or provide support that improves academic engagement, including those that:

- Prepare AmeriCorps Seniors volunteers to enter early learning careers.
- Serve people with arrest/conviction records, providing reentry opportunities.
- Include efforts to help local communities continue to recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Support civic bridgebuilding projects.

U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) - NJ State and Local Cybersecurity Program

The State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP) is a federal grant program administered by the United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and funded by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA). The overall goal of the SLCGP is to improve the cybersecurity posture of state, local, and territorial (SLT) government organizations by providing assistance for managing and reducing systemic cyber risk through the following 4 objectives:

- Objective 1: Develop and establish appropriate governance structures, as well as develop, implement, or revise cybersecurity plans, to improve capabilities to respond to cybersecurity incidents and ensure continuity of operations.
- Objective 2: SLT agencies understand their current cybersecurity posture and areas for improvement based on continuous testing, evaluation, and structured assessments.
- Objective 3: Implement security protections commensurate with risk.
- Objective 4: Ensure organization personnel are appropriately trained in cybersecurity, commensurate with responsibility.

U.S. Department of Agriculture

Rural Energy for America Program Renewable Energy Systems & Energy Efficiency Improvement Guaranteed Loans & Grants

USDA Rural Development provides loans and grants to help expand economic opportunities, create jobs, and improve the quality of life for millions of Americans in rural areas. This assistance supports infrastructure improvements; business development; housing; community facilities such as schools, public safety, health care, and high-speed internet access in rural, tribal, and high-poverty areas. **Application Deadlines:** 12/31/2023; 3/31/2024; and 6/30/2024, to the USDA Rural Development State Office

Business and Industry Guaranteed Loans

USDA Rural Development Loan guarantees to improve, develop, or finance business, industry, and employment and improve the economic and environmental climate in rural communities. **Application Deadline: Open**

Intermediary Relending Program

USDA Rural Development provides low-interest loans to local lenders known as intermediaries, who then relend the funds to businesses to improve economic conditions and create new opportunities in rural communities. **Application Deadlines: 12/31/2023; 3/31/2024; and 6/30/2024, to the USDA Rural Development State Office**

Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant (REDLG) Programs

USDA Rural Development provides funding for rural projects through local utility organizations. USDA provides zero-interest loans to local utilities which they, in turn, pass through to local businesses (ultimate recipients) for projects that will create and retain employment in rural areas. **Application Deadlines:** 12/31/2023; 3/31/2024; and 6/30/2024, to the <u>USDA Rural Development State Office</u>

Rural Business Investment Program

USDA Rural Development provides a Rural Business Investment Company (RBIC) license to newly formed developmental capital organizations to fill the need for business and development capital in rural areas. The program works with for-profit developmental capital funds. **Application Deadline: Open**

Climate Smart Practices on Agricultural Land

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is making more than \$3 billion in funding available for agricultural producers and forest landowners nationwide to participate in voluntary conservation programs and

adopt climate-smart practices in fiscal year 2024 as part of the Investing in America agenda.

These funds provide direct climate mitigation benefits, advance a host of other environmental co-benefits, and expand access to financial and technical assistance for producers to advance conservation on their farm, ranch or forest land through practices like cover cropping, conservation tillage, wetland restoration, prescribed grazing, nutrient management, tree planting and more.

USDA - Agricultural Marketing Service

The USDA Farm Labor Stabilization and Protection Pilot Program (FLSP) will award up to \$65 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding to provide support for agricultural employers in implementing robust labor standards to promote a safe, healthy work environment for both U.S. workers and workers hired under the seasonal H-2A visa program. The program is funded by the Farm Service Agency and will be administered by the Agricultural Marketing Service and the Farm Production and Conservation Business Center.

The 2023 FLSP grant application period has been extended and now closes January 3, 2024.

- Based on your employer type, applicants can apply for FLSP funding as a Fixed-site Employer; Farm Labor Contractor; or Joint Employer. <u>View implications of applying as a certain type of employer (pdf)</u>.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) announced it has opened the <u>2023 Clean School Bus (CSB)</u> Rebate Program. The 2023 rebate program offers at least \$500 million in rebate funding for clean school buses and zero-emission school buses with the potential to modify this figure based on the application pool and other factors.

Applications for the program are due by 4 p.m. ET on Jan. 31, 2024. <u>Learn more about program eligibility and application requirements</u>.

EPA is also working closely with the Joint Office of Energy and Transportation (Joint Office) to provide school districts with support as they plan for and implement adding electric school buses to their fleets. CSB Rebate Program applicants and participants can receive technical assistance from the Joint Office through one-on-one meetings, public webinars, and coordination on resource materials.

Assistance to Lower Heating Costs - U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS)

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Administration for Children & Families (ACF), announced nearly \$3.7 billion in Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) funds to help lower heating costs for American families this winter.

Additionally, HHS announced the new LIHEAP eligibility tool. The new user-friendly LIHEAP eligibility tool allows households across the country to quickly identify if they might be eligible for LIHEAP assistance by inputting basic information like income and household size.

The LIHEAP eligibility tool is available in English, Spanish, traditional Chinese and simplified Chinese. Individuals interested in applying for energy assistance can also visit <u>energyhelp.us</u> or call the National Energy Assistance Referral (NEAR) hotline toll-free at 866-674-6327.

NONPROFIT TIP OF THE MONTH FROM THE IRS

The IRS provided guidance that retirement arrangement (IRA) owners age 70½ or over can transfer up to \$100,000 to charity tax-free each year.

• These transfers, known as qualified charitable distributions or QCDs, offer eligible older Americans a way to give to charity before the end of the year. Normally, distributions from a traditional IRA are taxable when received. With a QCD, however, these distributions become tax-free if they're paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization.
